Why study Music?

Course Structure: What is it?

In A Level Music, students will have the opportunity to develop performance skills (solo and ensemble), composition, and knowledge of music. They will also develop their analytical skills by studying compositions from the Edexcel A Level Anthology of Music.

During the A Level course, students will complete the following:

A Level

Component 1 – Performance

Pieces can be performed in any style and can be presented as a soloist or part of an ensemble. The recital should be a minimum of 8 minutes. This is worth 30% of the total A grade.

Component 2 – Composition

This unit involves the composition of a piece of music. The total time for the composition must be a minimum of 6 minutes. This is worth 30% of the total A grade.

Component 3 – Appraising:

This unit involves the appraisal of music. It involves the study of music from the 19th century to the present day. This is worth 40% of the total A grade.
